**History**


Space Base Delta 1 has a proud history that leads back to the 21st Space Wing and 50th Space Wing as units of the Air Force Space Command based in Colorado Springs. The units were tasked with satellite command and control, and operation of early missile and space object detection equipment around the world.

Peterson-Schriever Garrison activated on July 24, 2020, replacing the 21st Space Wing and the 50th Space Wing. Peterson-Schriever Garrison was responsible for seven installations around the globe.


On May 23, 2022 Peterson-Schriever Garrison was redesignated as Space Base Delta 1.
